
CONISTON MIRROR

NAME INSPIRATION

Coniston mirror is named after Coniston Water in England's Lake District, the timber frame recalling the land that encircles the reflective lake.



JOINERY

Coniston features joinery invented by Matthew Hilton, which can only be achieved with CNC machinery. The joinery adds a beautiful decorative detail, while increasing the long grain to long grain bonds for greater stability.

VISUAL LIGHTNESS

Though Coniston utilises thick sections of solid timber for superior performance, great care has been taken to reduce the visual weight of the frame through the curves of the carved form.

REPLACEABLE GLASS

The mirror glass is replaceable for ease of repair.

INSTALLATION

Coniston hangs flat against the wall with a secure yet invisible hanging system. The rectangular mirror can be hung in four orientations and the round can be hung in two orientations - there is no top or bottom, allowing the user to choose their preferred orientation according to the unique wood grain on every piece.
